## PROJECTILE POINT TYPES 23 Years and Running Never-ending DRAFT Bibliography

INTRODUCTION: Projectile points for spears, darts and arrows have been manufactured out of stone and many other materials by every race and on every continent for thousands of years. It is a heritage of all humankind. This bibliography began with an internet message from Hugh Jarvis to the Arch-L list in the summer of 1994 with about a dozen references, and I became compulsive. These references include some from the "grey market". (i.e. tend to have prices listed but also can be good for type coverage). The collector's books with prices are also valuable aids for the archaeologist prosecuting an ARPA case in establishing commercial value. In order to provide some contextual framework, references are included which focus on: breakage, dating, descriptive systems, fluting, form, function, hafting, measurements, notching, and reshaping. This bibliography references at least 15 Ph.D. Dissertations and 24 Master's Theses. It also includes references on prehistoric and historic projectile points made from copper and iron. As a good cautionary reminder "Scholars..... should not be enslaved by static typology" (Wilke & Fleniken, 1991).
